

INTRODUCTION

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1. OVERVIEW

Australis Oil & Gas Limited is committed to ensuring that the personal information of our employees, securityholders and any people who deal with us is only collected, stored and used for legitimate and lawful purposes and in accordance with the Australian Privacy Principles (APPs) embodied in the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth) (as amended) (Privacy Act) and the Corporations Act 2001 (Cth) (Corporations Act).

2. WHAT IS PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Personal information is information or an opinion about an individual, or an individual who is reasonably identifiable, whether true or not and whether recorded in material form or not.

3. WHAT PERSONAL INFORMATION DO WE COLLECT?

We may collect personal information from you when you:

- (a) apply to be an employee or change your employment status with us;
- (b) apply for securities;
- (c) contact us by any method, such as telephone, email, post, facsimile or in person; and
- (d) access and use our website (www.australisoil.com) (Website) where we will record and log for statistical purposes certain information about such access and use, including your IP address, the date and time of your visit, the parts of our Website you access during your visit, your actions on our Website, and the browser you are using.

4. COOKIES

If you use our Website, some of the personal information referred to in section 3 above may be collected through the use of cookies. Most browsers are set by default to accept cookies. However, if you do not wish to receive any cookies you may set your browser to either prompt you whether you wish to accept cookies on a particular site, or by default reject cookies.

Please note that rejecting cookies may mean that some or all of the functions on our Website will not be available to you.

5. HOW IS YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION USED?

The personal information that we collect is generally used to communicate with you, and, if you use our Website, to track your usage, to evaluate performance of our Website. Information collected by us may also be used for the following purposes:

- in relation to your security holding;
- to provide you with information in relation to the group;
- to send email notifications;
- to conduct marketing activities and to conduct market research;



- to respond to your questions or suggestions; or
- to improve the quality of your visit to our Website.

You may opt out of receiving such information by notifying us accordingly, or using any unsubscribe facility we provide for that purpose.

6. DISCLOSURE OF YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

We do not sell, rent or trade personal information to or with any other third parties.

We will not otherwise disclose your personal information to any third party unless:

- it is in relation to your security holding, or your application for securities, in which case it may be disclosed to persons including but not limited to the registry, mail house, regulators and advisers;
- it is required by law, policy or the rules of any applicable securities exchange;
- that third party is a group company of ours, in which case that group company will only use and disclose your
 personal information in accordance with this privacy policy as if a reference in this privacy policy to us included
 a reference to that group company;
- that third party is a contractor engaged to provide goods or services to us (including goods or services that
 assist us in providing our Website). This may include disclosure to contractors outside of Australia. Our
 agreements with such contractors require that they keep your personal information confidential, and that they
 only use or disclose your personal information for the purposes of providing those goods or services to us;
- such disclosure is in connection with the sale of some or all of our business or assets; or
- you have consented for us to share the information for this purpose, or the disclosure is authorised by the Privacy Act including:
 - o to lessen or prevent a serious threat to life or health;
 - o to protect the personal safety of users of our Website or the public;
 - o if authorised or required by law;
 - o if we have reason to suspect that unlawful activity has been, is being or may be engaged in;
 - to enforce the law or where necessary to investigate a suspected unlawful activity; or
 - you would reasonably expect or we have told you that your personal information is usually used or disclosed to third parties in this way.

7. ACCESS AND CORRECTION OF YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

We will, on request, provide you with access to the personal information we hold about you, including for the purpose of correcting or updating that information, unless there is an exception to such disclosure which applies under the APPs.

If you require access to your personal information, please contact the Company Secretary. Before we provide you with access to your personal information we will require some proof of identity. For most requests, your information will be provided free of charge, however, we may charge a reasonable fee if your request requires a substantial effort on our part.

If we refuse to provide you with access to the information, we will provide you with reasons for the refusal and inform you of any exceptions relied upon under the APPs (unless it would be unreasonable to do so).

We take reasonable steps to ensure that your personal information is accurate, complete, and up-to-date whenever we collect or use it. If the personal information we hold about you is inaccurate, incomplete, irrelevant or out-of-date, please contact us and we will take reasonable steps to either correct this information, or if necessary, discuss alternative action with you.

8. HOW WE HOLD AND SECURE YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

The security of your personal information is important to us. We take reasonable steps to prevent the personal information we hold about you from misuse, interference or loss, and from unauthorised access, modification or disclosure. This includes the use of technologies and processes such as access control procedures, network firewalls, encryption and physical security to protect the privacy of your personal information.



9. SECURITYHOLDER INFORMATION

If you are a securityholder, the Corporations Act requires us to collect information about your name, address and security holding and include these in our register, which is held by us and on our behalf by our registry from time to time. We must keep this information included in the register for as long as you remain a securityholder and for a period after you cease to be a securityholder.

The Corporations Act also requires us to grant access to anyone to inspect our register on request and, under certain circumstances, to obtain a copy. We may provide information from the share register to meet specific requests, for example, identifying the top 20 shareholders or in request under the Corporations Act in a takeover offer context. Securityholder information will not be knowingly disclosed for purposes other than those which we consider to be in the best interests of the shareholders or as required by the Corporations Act, other law, policy or the rules of any applicable securities exchange.

As securityholders, you may also be required to provide us with your tax file number or financial institution account details so that we may make dividend and other payments to you. In compliance with Australian tax laws, we also provide certain advice to the Australian Taxation Office, including dividend information.

Under the *Anti-Money Laundering and Counter Terrorism Financing Act 2006* (Cth), our share registry from time to time may collect personal information about you (such as your legal name and other names you may be known by, your residential street address and your date of birth) and hold other documents in order to verify your identity. This information is generally not included in the public register and is restricted to us, authorised share register employees and regulators.

10. LINKS TO OTHER WEBSITES

Sometimes our Website contains links to other websites. When you access a website other than our Website, we are not responsible for the privacy practices of that site. We recommend that you review the privacy policies of each website you visit.
